- Do you have enough time to delegate the job effectively? Time involving training and progress checking
- Is this a task that I should delegate?

If you can answer "yes" to a few of the above questions, then it could well be worth delegating

Efficiency:

A strong team will develop systems that allow them to collaborate efficiently to complete tasks in a timely manner. Working together, colleagues will be aware of their own capabilities and the capabilities of the group.

Support:

Workplaces have challenges but having a strong team in place can act as a support mechanism for other staff members. They can help each other improve their own performance as well as working together to further improve their professional development. Building strong bonds on trust can be extremely important when facing a particularly difficult challenge.
